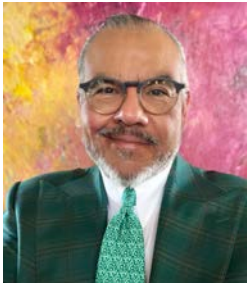

70 YEARS OF SERVICE: A PATH FORWARD

CASA CENTRAL PROGRAMS TRANSFORM LIVES

At Casa Central, we believe no one should face hardship alone. Guided by this belief, we deliver high-quality comprehensive programs that serve thousands of individuals and families annually across the Chicago area. Our work is centered on honoring the dignity of every person, meeting people where they are, and addressing critical needs at every stage of life.

Through three core program areas—Children and Youth Services, Individuals and Families, and Older Adult Services—we provide award-winning services that strengthen families and uplift communities. From early learning and violence prevention to housing support and senior care, Casa Central creates pathways for long-term stability and well-being.



CHILDREN AND YOUTH SERVICES:

INSPIRING LIFELONG LEARNING

Casa Central supports the early growth and development of children from birth through age 12 through high-quality programming that meet families where they are. Our **Early Learning Academy (ELA) Center-Based** program supports children's educational and social development. In a safe, welcoming environment led by experienced educators, children engage in hands-on learning to build confidence, curiosity, and school readiness.

Our **ELA Home-Based** program extends this same support into the homes of families, home visitors build trusted relationships with parents and caregivers, providing guidance and resources that strengthen the parent-child bond to prepare children for long-term success. A new program model, **Creciendo Juntos, A Preparing For Life Program**, is an innovative partnership between Casa Central, The Center for the Economics of Human Development at the University of Chicago (CEHD) and Preparing for Life - Dublin (PFL) that provides home visiting support to families starting at pregnancy through five years old.

For older children, ages five - 12, our **School Age Program (SAP)** offers a consistent, year-round environment for academic enrichment, social-emotional learning, and recreational activities. We're grateful for the support we receive from our funders, such as Amazon, the Paul M. Angell Family Foundation and the Sumac Foundation that help to advance our work, with a special emphasis on STEM education for our children.



FIRST STEPS FORWARD:

HOW HOME-BASED SUPPORT HELPED MIA LEARN TO WALK

When Camila noticed that her one-year-old daughter, Mia, wasn't yet walking, she grew concerned. Every time she tried to stand Mia up, she would sit back down and crawl away. Camila worried something might be wrong—but she also knew she didn't have to face it alone.

Camila turned to Casa Central's Early Learning Academy (ELA) Home-Based program, seeking support and guidance. Through regular home visits, an ELA home visitor partnered with Camila, offering reassurance and practical strategies to strengthen Mia's gross motor skills. Together, they introduced tailored activities into their routine—fun, engaging exercises that encouraged Mia to pull up, balance, and eventually take steps.

The home visitor also helped Camila see her home as a rich learning environment, filled with everyday opportunities to promote Mia's development.

By using toys, furniture, and even daily chores creatively, Camila helped her daughter build strength and confidence.

With consistency, encouragement, and a lot of love, Mia began to change. What started as hesitant efforts turned into steady progress. Before long, the little girl who once crawled away from every attempt to stand was walking on her own—her confidence growing with every step.

Mia's journey was a shared triumph: the result of a parent's determination, a trusted partnership with Casa Central, and the power of meeting families where they are. Thanks to ELA's Home-Based Program, Camila didn't just help her daughter walk—she helped her move forward, ready for whatever comes next.

INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES:

PROVIDING SAFETY AND FOSTERING SELF-RELIANCE



Our programs for individuals and families address immediate needs while supporting long-term stability. **La Posada** provides transitional housing and comprehensive services to families experiencing homelessness, helping them transition to permanent housing and greater independence. **Intact Family Services** works with families involved in the child welfare system, offering in-home support to strengthen parenting skills, stabilize households, and keep children safely at home. The **Violence Prevention and Intervention (VPI)** program delivers trauma-informed counseling and advocacy for individuals and families impacted by domestic violence, with a focus on supporting young children and their caregivers. Across these services, Casa Central helps families heal, grow, and move forward with confidence.

A NEW BEGINNING:

HOW ALICIA REBUILT HER LIFE WITH SUPPORT FROM LA POSADA

After six years of caring for her elderly grandmother, Alicia suddenly found herself without a home. When her grandmother passed away, the apartment they shared—and the stability it represented—slipped away as well. With no income and no safety net, Alicia couldn't keep up with the rent and utility bills. Before long, Alicia and her three children were evicted.

With nowhere else to turn, Alicia called 311 for help. She was referred to Casa Central's La Posada program. At La Posada, Alicia was greeted by her family support case manager and moved into a transitional private apartment, complete with all the essentials for her and her children. The relief was immediate. For the first time in weeks, Alicia could breathe, knowing her family had a safe and stable place to rest and recover.

While at La Posada, Alicia received intensive case management and wraparound services tailored to her goals. Her biggest challenge was re-entering the workforce after so many years as a full-time caregiver. With the help of the program's EDUCATE training area, she began building a resume and enrolled in GED classes. Her dedication paid off—she landed a part-time job and participated in a study that provided her with a stipend to pay off past-due utility bills.

Working closely with her case manager, Alicia also applied for subsidized housing. She was approved and found a three-bedroom apartment close to her children's school and public transportation. Through Casa Central's partnership with the Chicago Furniture Bank, she was able to furnish her new home—turning an empty apartment into a place of comfort and pride.

Alicia's progress didn't stop there. Her part-time position eventually became full-time employment, providing even more stability for her family. Throughout her time at La Posada, Alicia and her case manager worked as a team, tackling every challenge with determination and hope.

Now in permanent housing and full-time employment, Alicia has her eyes on the future. Her long-term goals include maintaining her home, growing her savings, and eventually living independently without the need for a subsidy.

Alicia's story is one of resilience and possibility. With support, encouragement, and the right resources, she built a new beginning, for herself and her children, and is confidently moving forward toward the life she envisions.

OLDER ADULT SERVICES:

PROMOTING ACTIVE, HEALTHY LIFESTYLES



Casa Central has long honored the wisdom and contributions of older adults by providing care that supports independence and connection. At our Adult Wellness Center (AWC), participants have found joy, purpose and community through daily activities, nutritious meals, and compassionate care—all in a welcoming and affirming environment. For those who prefer to remain in their homes, our Home Care Services have provided respectful assistance with daily tasks, meals, and personal care so they can continue to live safely, independently, and comfortably. Whether at our center or at home, our older adult participants are never alone. They are valued, supported, and empowered to live full, meaningful lives.

FINDING HER JOY AGAIN:

LUCILLE'S JOURNEY TO CONNECTION AND COMMUNITY AT CASA CENTRAL

After more than three decades as a beloved teacher, Lucille took great pride in having helped shape the minds of hundreds of children over the years. Education wasn't just her profession—it was her passion. Even after retiring over ten years ago, she still lit up when recalling stories from the classroom.

But recently, life at home began to feel much smaller.

Arthritis made daily tasks difficult, and giving up driving left Lucille feeling isolated and discouraged. "I used to go out and do everything on my own," she shared. "When I had to stop driving, I felt like I lost a part of myself." Her daughter noticed the shift too—and during a visit to the doctor, they shared their growing concerns.

That visit became a turning point. Lucille's physician referred her to be evaluated for adult day services, and she was introduced to Casa Central's Adult Wellness Center (AWC). At first, Lucille was hesitant. "I told them I liked being at home," she said with a shrug. "And if I didn't like it, I was going to leave the program."

Six months later, Lucille is one of AWC's most enthusiastic participants.

"I thought I was going to be bored," she admits, "but I've made so many friends. I love the field trips—especially when we go shopping. I love to dance. I help decorate for events and even paint. I feel very happy here."

At Casa Central's AWC, Lucille found more than just daily support. She found connection, purpose, and joy. And while she still enjoys the comfort of her home, Lucille no longer feels stuck inside it. Lucille's story is a testament to how the right support can make all the difference—and how every older adult deserves to live a life that's full, active, and meaningful.

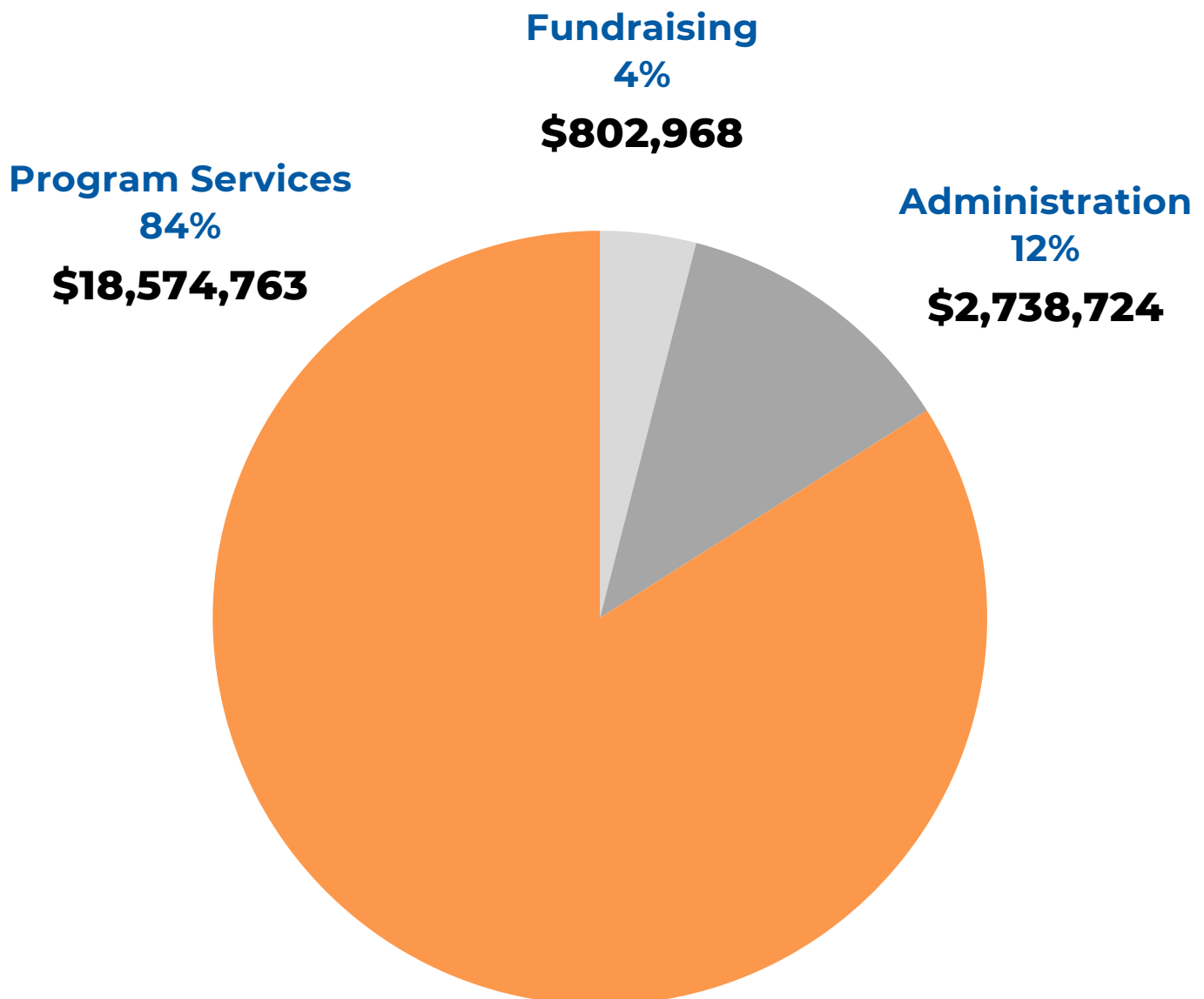
HOW FUNDS ARE USED

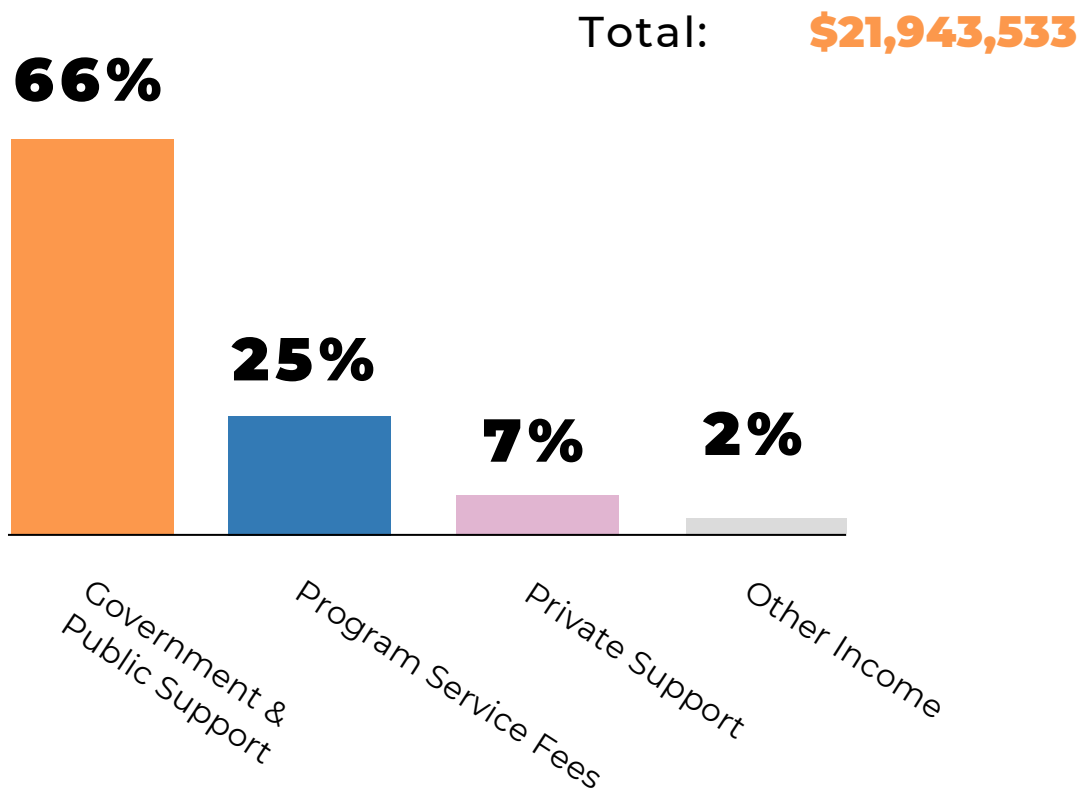
